# **Annual Report on the Activities of**

# Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs and Disaster Management of the National Unity Government $16^{th}\ April\ 2022$

## Introduction

The Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs and Disaster Management of the National Unity Government has been implementing the following humanitarian activities in accordance with the policies, strategies and action plans spending the total budget of (2.73) billion MMK from 16<sup>th</sup> April 2021 to 10<sup>th</sup> April 2022;

Of all the support delivered, the highest amount, almost half of the funding has been spent on the humanitarian delivery for internally displaced people. As per the latest report issued by UNHCR on 6<sup>th</sup> April 2022, there are over (500,000) internally displaced people since the military coup, and the Ministry has provided humanitarian aid to about (100,000) IDPs in every month covering about 20% of the total population affected by armed conflict in Myanmar.

According to the statistics, humanitarian assistances were delivered to the following States and Regions depending on the needs, and Kayin, Sagaing, Karenni, Chin and Magway had received the highest amount of contributions.



In the course of humanitarian delivery, the Ministry has joined hands with the Coordination Committee, People's administrative and defence members, members of parliament, local civil society organisations and volunteers. The Ministry has also been distributing humanitarian aid to the needy populations on the ground with the support of the Ministry's staff.

# **Donations from inside and outside the Country**

Majority of the contribution has come from people-to-people donation, and there are a few contributions made by the individual persons and organisations from foreign countries. As of the reporting period, it can be said that there is no contribution from UN and International agencies. As such, People Republic of Korea, United State of America and Japan have

contributed the most, and contribution of the respective countries can be seen in the chart below;



### **Other Activities**

Over one-year period of the National Unity Government, the Ministry has undertaken the following important tasks;

- (1) Creating job opportunities and income generation, capacity building and psychosocial support activities and early children care and development for CDM staff
- (2) Psychosocial Support for the general public
  - Mind healer programme for those who suffered from distress and need counselling
  - Group counselling and support activities (for instance: PDF members and IDPs)
  - Broadcasting of Psychosocial Health Talk Programme on every Thursday
  - Psychosocial First Aid Training
  - Mental Health Activity: Meditation Sessions
- (3) Disaster Preparedness and Awareness Activities
  - Disaster Preparedness and Response Trainings

In order to implement the Ministry's functions effectively, the Ministry has extended its

partnership with the Coordination Committee, line Ministries, respective committees and local

and international organisations. During this time, there are (62) coordination meetings with

international organisations and (74) meetings with local organisations. Moreover, the Ministry

has been actively engaging with the activities undertaken by (10) other Committees and

Commissions.

**Bottlenecks and Challenges Encountered** 

The main challenges faced during the humanitarian provision include fund flow, limited

manpower, and reduction of donation due to the concentration on the people's defensive war.

What's more, the conventional way of policies and practices of the UN and INGOs has

hindered the fund contribution to be spent on humanitarian work.

**Way Forward** 

The Ministry of Humanitarian Affairs and Disaster Management has envisioned to proceed

with its humanitarian interventions as per the policies and guidelines laid down. Furthermore,

it will be conducting damage and needs assessment, and developing the strategic plan for the

rehabilitation and reconstruction of the affected villages and communities. At the same time,

efforts will also be made in building alliances with the ethnic organisations to further strengthen

alliance and partnership in many other aspects. The Ministry will also seek to extend

collaboration with UN and International organisations. Besides, it has been engaging with the

Joint Coordination Committee on Humanitarian Assistance which can help enhance the

humanitarian countermeasures done by National Unity Consultative Committee (NUCC) and

National Unity Government (NUG). Arrangements are underway to get easy access for the

international community and private donors to donate on the Ministry's Website.
