


India and Myanmar are neighbors who share a border stretching 1468km, and share a history of friendship, cooperation, and diverse, socio-cultural heritage.



Myanmar

The people of Myanmar have been struggling for equal political representation for more than 70 years.

Since 1962, Myanmar people have suffered violence, discrimination, and disenfranchisement from the dictatorial political system.



In 2015, the landslide victory for the Democratic party via a military-drafted constitution led to a 5-year period of quasi-civilian government, until 2020.

Federa

On February 1st, 2021,

the Myanmar military attempted to stage a coup to overthrow all the civilian government, and arrested leaders, civilians, and dissidents across the nation.

In the 500 days since the coup attempt, the military has undertaken a campaign of terror across Myanmar, killing civilians, women, children, disabled and senior people.

The aggression of the military has caused a million displaced and six million in need of emergency support. There are 60,000 refugee movements to neighboring countries including India since February 2021 (UNHCR June 2022).









and 10,000+ soldiers from inside their ranks have defected which is the largest defection ever in the country.

Soldiers and policemen with their families are leaving the institution that orders them to kill and burn the villages.

The Government of India

has been complicit in the military regime since 2021.

They sent representatives to the military parades in the country's capital.

Over 30 protestors were killed that day by the junta.



The Government of India is selling arms directly to the regime, continuing the navy training with the Myanmar Military, and allowing diplomatic relations to continue, thereby legitimizing the junta.
