




From March 22 to March 28, 2023, within 1 week, there were about (92) clashes between the Military Council's army and the People's Defense Forces, Ethnic Revolutionary Organizations in Myanmar.






From March 22 to March 28, 2023, within 1 week, there were about (27) landmine attacks operated by the local People's Defense Forces and Ethnic Revolutionary Organizations in Myanmar.






From March 22 to March 28, 2023, within 1 week, there were at least (25) drone strikes operated by local People's Defense Forces throughout Myanmar.






From March 22 to March 28, 2023, within 1 week, there were at least (17) Bomb attacks operated by revolutionary forces throughout Myanmar.





From March 22 to March 28, 2023, within 1 week, there were at least (27) air strikes operated by the Military Council's army.





From March 22 to March 28, 2023, within 1 week, there were at least (103) civilian casualties throughout Myanmar. There were 59 deaths and 44 injured. These casualties were caused by air strikes, heavy weapons, land mines, shootings and oppression.



Summary

- From March 22 to 28, within 1 week, 12 people were shot dead for being identified as traitors or informers.
- From March 22 to 28, within 1 week, at least 55 civilians were arrested by the Military Council's army in battle areas throughout Myanmar.
- From February 1, 2021, to March 28, 2023, 3,166 people were killed by the Military Council's army.
- On March 28, in KNU Brigade (5) area, the KNU reseized the military's Mae Khae Htaw camp beside the Than Lwin River.



Condition of IDPs

- From March 22 to 28, within a week, around 10,000 people from all over Myanmar were forced to flee from the war as the Military Council's troops raided villages and burned down around 1,500 civilian houses.
- In Khin Oo Township, Mya Kan village was invaded and destroyed by the army. Around 1,000 people were fleeing the war because of the shooting.
- In Kanbalu Township, the army burned and destroyed Nyang Zingyi village. About 10,000 people were fleeing the war because of the shooting and burning by the Myanmar army. (March 23)
- In Kyaikto Township, the military column was marching, so the villagers close to the column fled the war. (March 25)
- In Budalin Township, Songkone village was burnt down by the army and 6 civilians were killed. (March 25)

Battles and Operations

- A battle broke out between the Military Council's Army and the CDF on the Matupi--Paletwa road in Matupi Township, and 6 soldiers of the Military Council were killed. (March 22)
- In Di Maw So, Bawlakhae and Pin Long areas, Karenni, the battles took place between the military council and Karenni revolutionary forces and a regiment of the army was killed. (March 24)
- In the Sagaing, PDF attacked Balu troops of the military council who raided villages by villages and killed civilians, killing 11 soldiers of military council. (March 24)
- Karen revolutionary forces attacked five places where the Military Council was stationed in Kawkareik Township, killing at least 15 Military Council soldiers. (March 25)
