

Between 27 March and 2 April 2026, there were at least 168 incidents of military operations and civilian-targeted attacks across the country. Among them, at least 97 incidents were military operations and 71 incidents were civilian-targeted attacks.

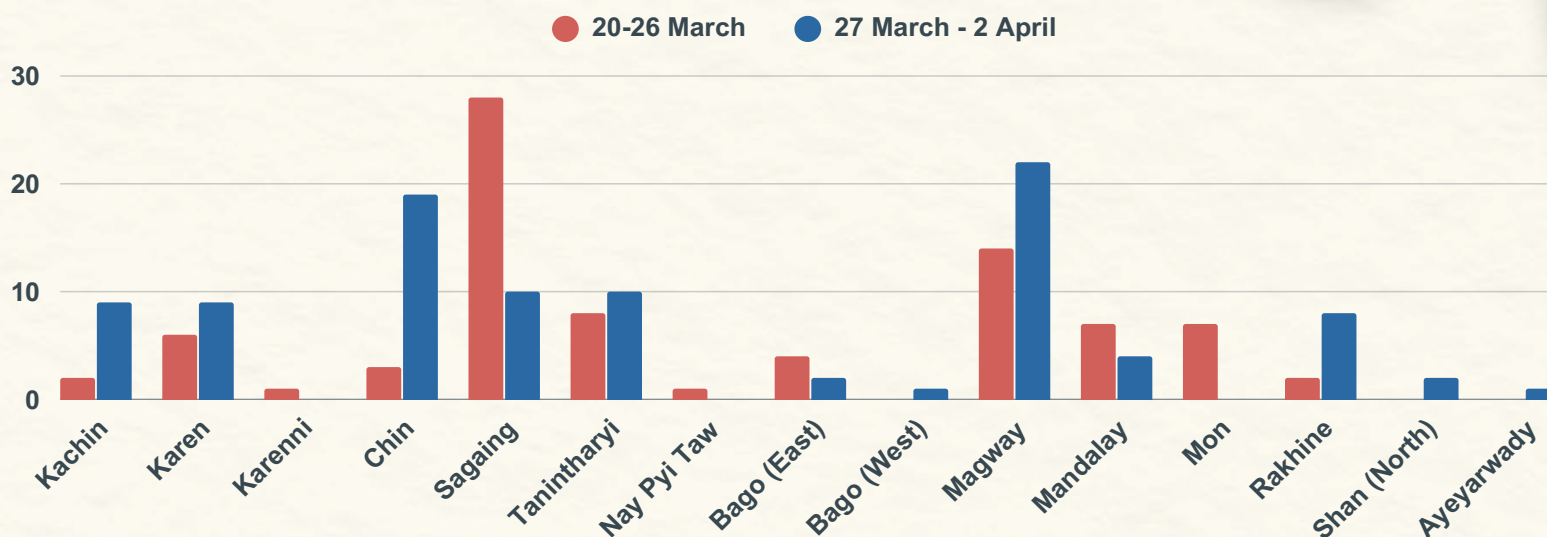
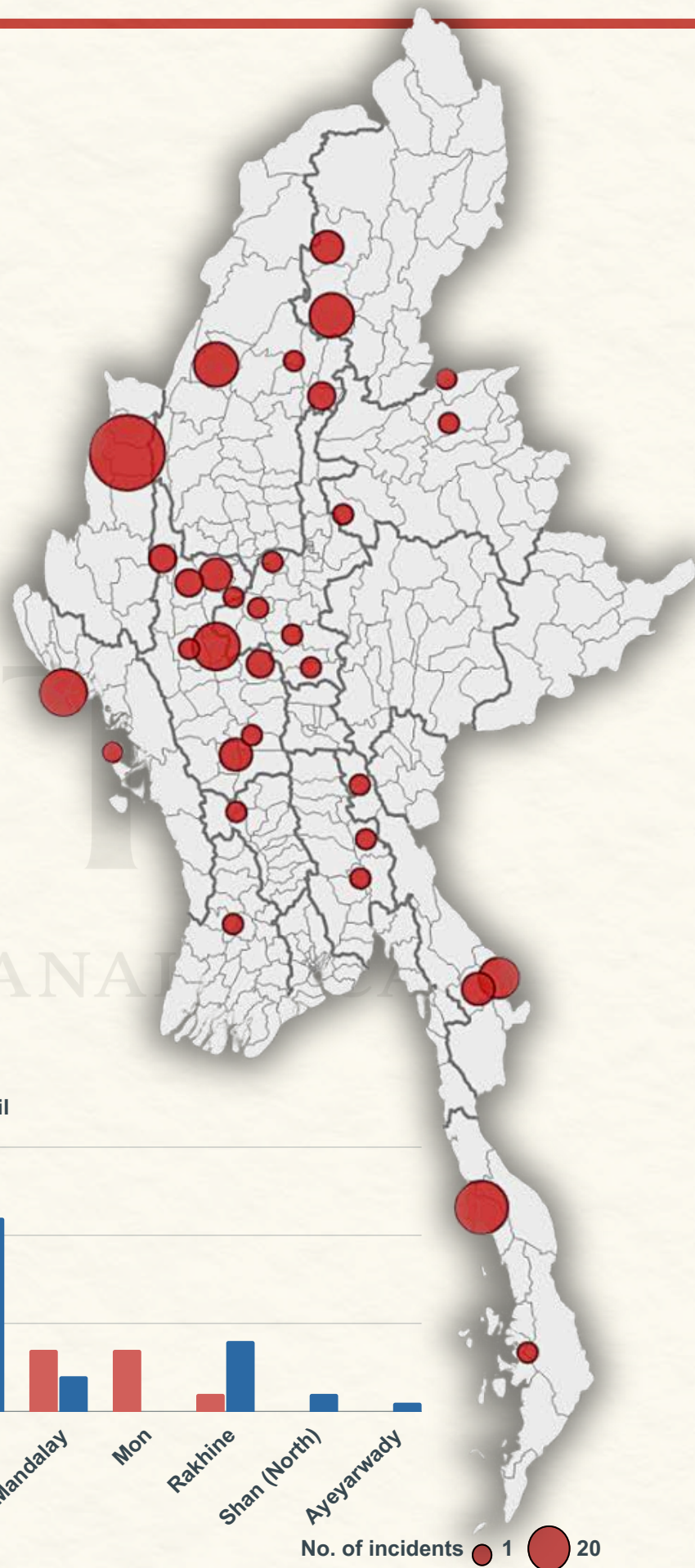
On 31 March, the group of Pyithu Hluttaw representatives under the military junta elected Min Aung Hlaing as Vice President. The group of Amyotha Hluttaw representatives elected Nan Ni Ni Aye, Chairperson of the Union Solidarity and Development Party (USDP) from Karen Region, as Vice President. The group of military representatives also elected the military junta's Prime Minister Nyo Saw as Vice President. On the same day, Min Aung Hlaing transferred his role as Commander-in-Chief of the Defence Services to General Ye Win Oo, and assigned General Kyaw Swar Lin as Deputy Commander-in-Chief of the Defence Services. In addition, Lieutenant General Ko Ko Oo was appointed as the Joint Commander-in-Chief (Army, Navy, Air Force). On 3 April, the junta held the presidential election in Nay Pyi Taw and Min Aung Hlaing was elected as President with 429 votes. The junta's Prime Minister Nyo Saw received 126 votes and became Vice President 1, while Daw Nan Ni Ni Aye received 29 votes and became Vice President 2.

WEEKLY ARMED INCIDENTS

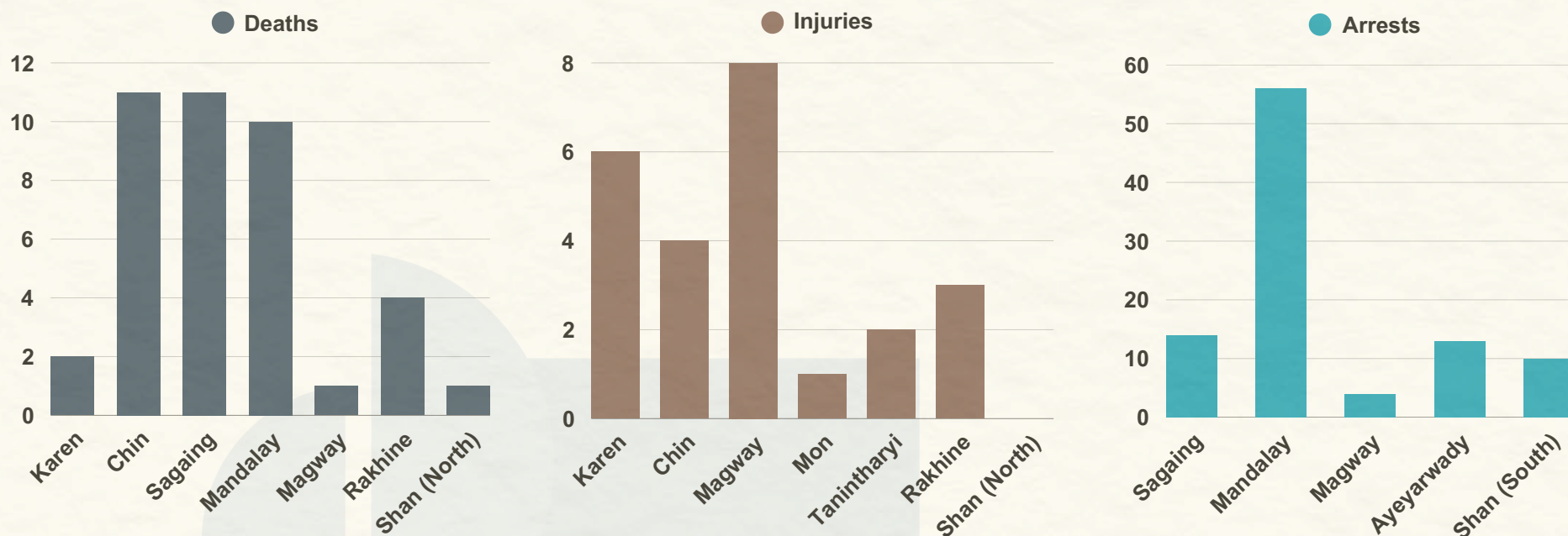
During the reporting period, at least 97 armed incidents were reported in 33 townships across the country. Magway Region recorded the highest number of reported incidents with 22 incidents in total. Compared to the previous week, the number of armed clashes decreased.

Combat engagements were recorded as the highest attack type with 48 incidents. Of these, eight incidents involved the seizure of military bases and towns by the military junta and armed revolutionary forces. On 29 and 30 March, the military junta launched large-scale offensives against armed revolutionary forces in Katha and Tigyaing towns in Sagaing Region, and subsequently recaptured them. In addition, there were also incidents in Kachin Region where military bases of the military junta in Hpakant were seized by the Kachin Independence Army (KIA) and allied forces.

It was observed that there were no armed clashes in Shan (East), Shan (South), and Yangon regions for two consecutive weeks. Karenni, Mon, and Nay Pyi Taw regions also reported no military operations this week, although incidents were recorded in the previous week. Meanwhile, Bago (West), Shan (North), and Ayeyarwady regions reported incidents this week, despite no incidents being recorded in these regions during the previous week.



No. of incidents ● 1 ● 20

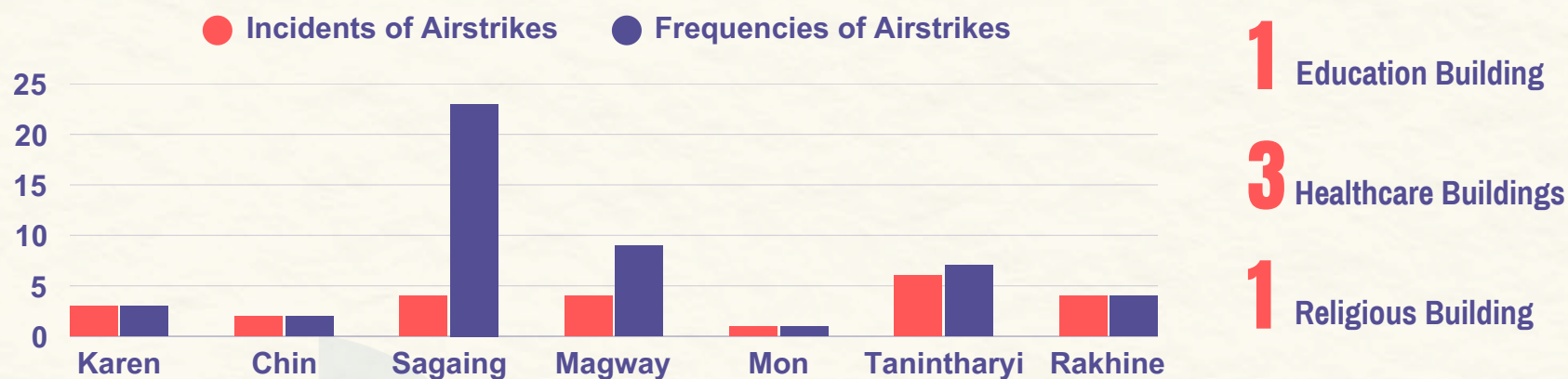


CIVILIAN TARGETED ATTACKS

During the reporting period, at least 71 incidents of civilian-targeted attacks were reported in 43 townships. During these incidents, at least 40 civilians were killed, 52 others were injured while 87 civilians were arbitrarily arrested. Of these incidents, the junta's aerial attacks were recorded as the highest with 24 incidents. Village raids conducted by the junta troop recorded as the second highest with 19 incidents while civilian arrests cases were the third highest with eight incidents. Compared to the previous week, the number of civilian-targeted attacks decreased.

The highest number of civilian casualties was reported in Sagaing Region, with 10 deaths and 28 injuries. Chin Region was marked as the region with the second highest number of civilian casualties, recording at least 11 deaths and four injuries. The third highest region was Mandalay, with at least 10 injuries.

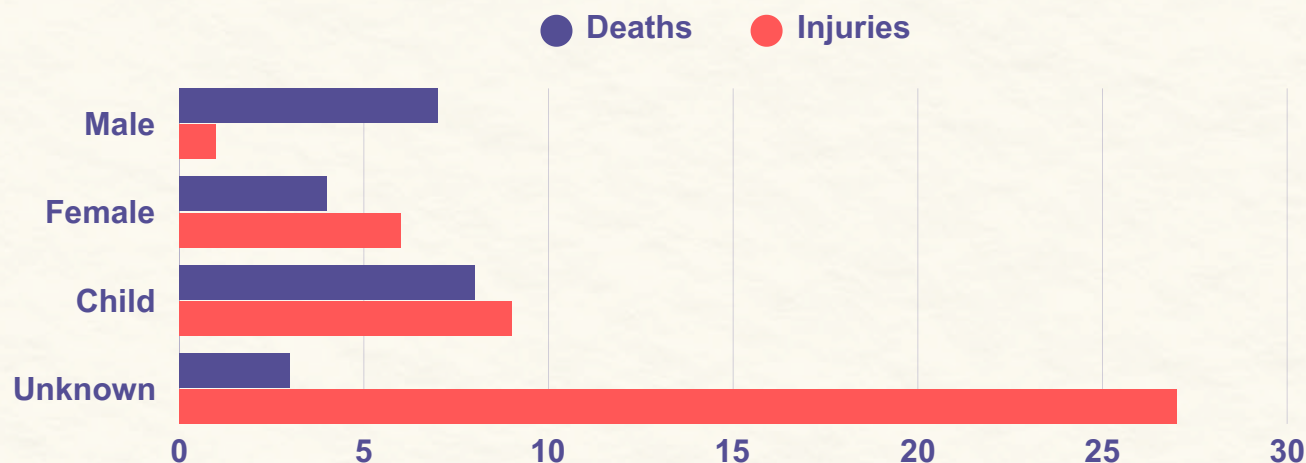
Meanwhile, the highest number of civilian arrests was reported in Mandalay Region with 46 detainees during the reporting period. Sagaing Region recorded the second highest of civilian arrests with 14 detainees while Ayeyarwady was the third highest with 13.

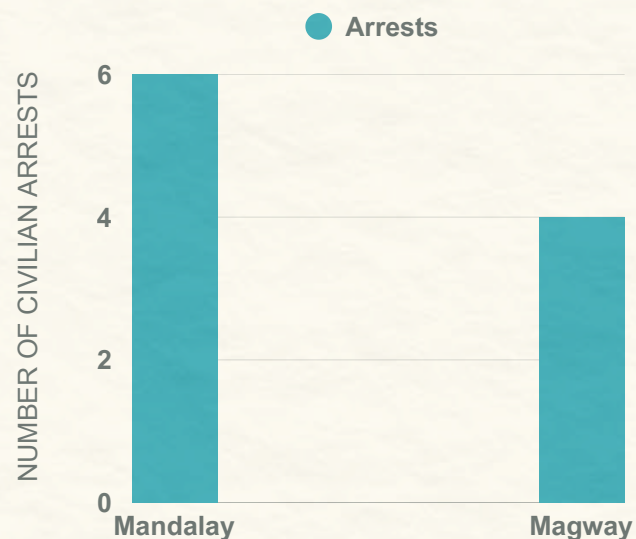
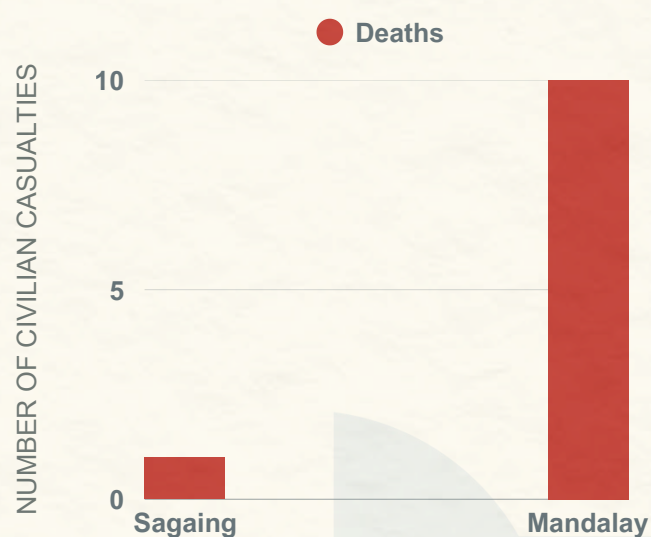


MILITARY AIRSTRIKES ON CIVILIANS

During the reporting period, at least 24 incidents of civilian-targeted airstrikes committed by the military junta were reported across 18 townships of seven regions. In these incidents, 22 civilians were killed while 43 others were injured. Majority of airstrikes was reported in Tanintharyi Region with six incidents.

Significantly, at least two massacre incidents resulted from aerial attacks were recorded in Sagaing and Chin Regions during the reporting period. In these incidents, at least 16 civilians were killed and 27 others were injured.



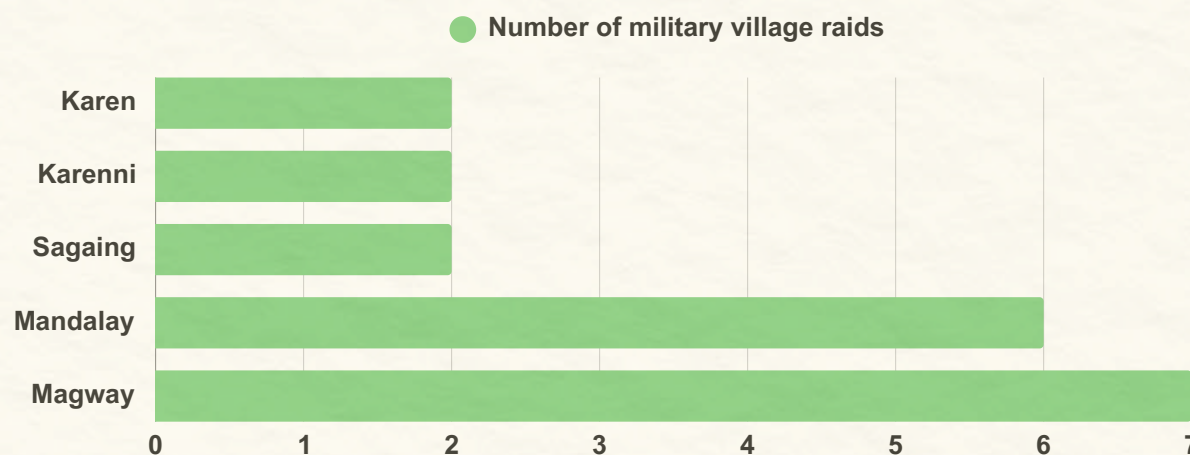


MILITARY VILLAGE RAIDS

During the reporting period, at least 19 incidents of village raids conducted by the military junta were reported in 11 townships across the country. In these incidents, 11 civilians were killed while 10 civilians were arrested. Magway Region was recorded as the highest incident of village raids with seven incidents while the second highest was Mandalay Region with six incidents. The third was Sagaing, Karen, and Karenni regions with two incidents each.

On 2 April, a military column advanced into a village in Myingyan Township, Mandalay Region, and carried out attacks using small firearms and drones. As a result, 10 civilians, including one child, were killed.

METHODOLOGY

This report by the Nyan Lynn Thit Analytica (NLTA) aims to examine armed clashes between the military and armed revolutionary forces and internal conflicts between armed revolutionary forces including civilian casualties. Data has been collected from 43 news media and announcements of revolutionary organizations. The actual data on the ground might be higher than the numbers presented in this report. This report excludes unverified armed incidents and casualties, which will be reported in future reports once verified. An incident is counted as a single attack if one target is attacked either by the military junta or armed revolutionary forces, which include the People Defense Forces (PDFs) and Ethnic Revolutionary Organizations (EROs). Additionally, the report analyzed civilian casualties in two categories: those resulting from armed incidents and those from targeted attacks.
