


MASSACRES CONDUCTED BY THE MILITARY

From January to March 2026, at least 37 incidents of massacres were committed by the military junta and armed revolutionary forces across 30 townships, resulting in at least 426 civilian deaths. Among them, the majority of massacre incidents was military airstrikes with 23 incidents. The military village raids were reported to be the second highest with four incidents while the military's paramotor attacks were reported as the third highest with three incidents. Meanwhile, the highest number of civilian deaths occurred in Sagaing Region with 201 deaths, followed by Magway with 55, Kachin with 53, and Bago (East) with 36. Sagaing Region was also observed as the region with the highest number of incidents with 17, followed by Magway with five incidents.



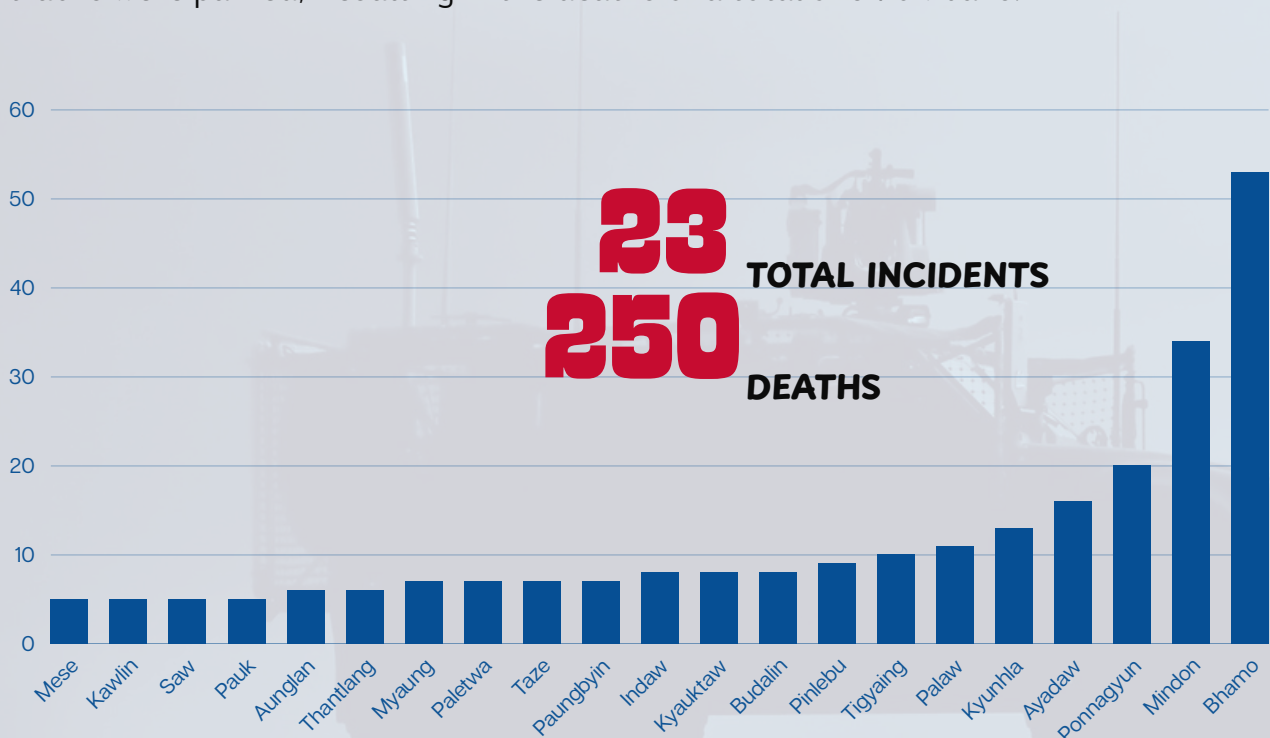

MASSACRES RESULTED FROM AIRSTRIKES

During the reporting period, airstrikes conducted by the military junta attributed to the highest number of massacres and civilian deaths across the country. At least 23 incidents of civilian-targeted aerial attacks carried out by the junta were reported in seven regions, resulting in at least 250 civilian deaths. Among these, 11 incidents in Sagaing were recorded as the highest, resulting in at least 90 civilian deaths. Magway followed with approximately 50 civilian deaths during four incidents. In Kachin, Rakhine, and Chin, two incidents each were recorded as the third highest, resulting in at least 94 civilian deaths.

Among these incidents, the one with the highest number of civilian casualties occurred in Bhamo Township, Kachin Region. On 10 March, the military junta carried out airstrikes targeting gold mining sites in the Sinkhan area of Bhamo Township using Y-12 aircraft and fighter jets, resulting in the deaths of 30 civilians.

The second deadliest incident involving civilian casualties occurred in Mindon Township, Magway Region. On 1 March, the military junta carried out a bombing attack with fighter jets on a location near a village in Mindon Township where civilian trucks were parked, resulting in the deaths of a total of 34 civilians.

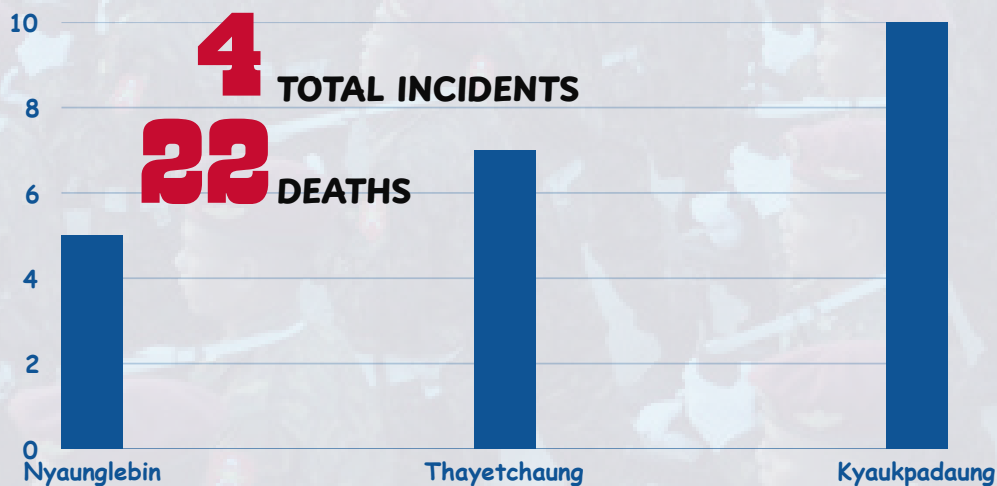


Massacre Deaths by Airstrikes per Township from January to March 2026

MASSACRES RESULTED FROM **MILITARY VILLAGE RAIDS**

In this category, the military along with Pyu Saw Htee militia committed various atrocities such as arrest, arson, rape, and killing of civilian hostages. From January to March 2026, village raids conducted by military columns were the second most cause of massacre incidents leading to high casualties. At least four massacres were reported across the country, resulting in 22 civilian deaths. There were two incidents in Mandalay, one incident each in Bago (East) and Tanintharyi resulting in civilian deaths of 10 in Mandalay, five in Bago (East) and seven in Tanintharyi.

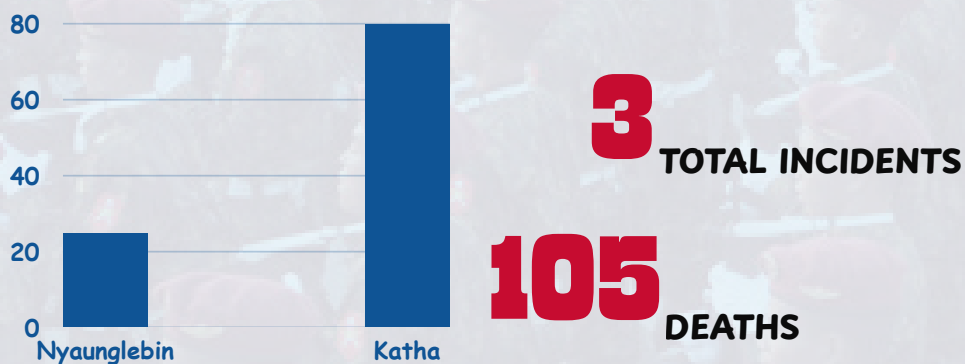
On 27 February, a military column of the junta arrested and executed seven civilians in a village in Thayetchaung Township, Tanintharyi Region. In addition, on 18 March, another junta military column arrested and killed five civilians from a village in Kyaukpadaung Township, Mandalay Region.

MASSACRE RESULTED DURING COMBAT ENGAGEMENT

During the reporting period, three massacre incidents were reported during combat engagements between the junta and armed revolutionary forces in Bago (East) and Sagaing regions, with 105 civilian deaths. On 7 March, in Kyaukkyi Township, Bago (East) Region, armed clashes broke out between the junta and the Karen National Liberation Army (KNLA), during which the junta carried out airstrikes and drone attacks, killing 25 civilians, including six males, 16 females and three children. In addition, on 20 March, during armed clashes between the military junta and armed resistance forces in Katha Township, Sagaing Region, the junta carried out airstrikes using fighter jets, resulting in the deaths of 80 civilians.

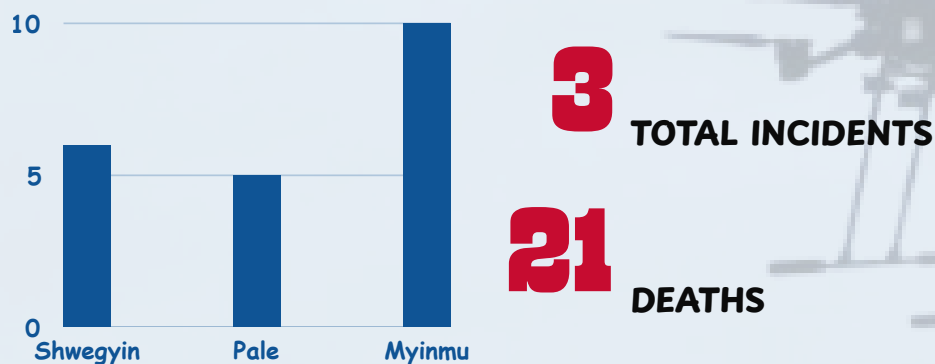


Massacre Deaths by Combat Engagements per Township from January to March 2026

MASSACRES RESULTED FROM PARAMOTOR ATTACKS

During the reporting period, three incidents of mass civilian casualties occurred in Sagaing and Bago (East) as a result of paramotor bombing attacks carried out by the military junta, resulting in the deaths of 21 civilians.

On 23 February, the junta carried out a bombing attack on a village in Myinmu Township, Sagaing Region, using two paramotors, killing 10 civilians and injuring another 10.

MASSACRES RESULTED FROM DRONE ATTACKS

During the reporting period, one massacre was reported in Sagaing Region as a result of drone attacks conducted by the military junta, leading to the deaths of nine civilians.

On 7 March, a village in Kani Township, Sagaing Region, was bombed with three suicide drones launched by the Northwestern Regional Military Command (Na Ma Kha), resulting in the deaths of nine civilians, including two children.

MASSACRES RESULTED FROM **EXTRAJUDICIAL KILLINGS**

Between January and March 2026, one massacre incident was reported as a result of killings by the junta soldiers, leading to the deaths of seven civilians. This incident occurred in Tanintharyi Region.

On 13 March, in Thayetchaung Township, Tanintharyi Region, members of the military junta retreating from the Win Wa military camp abducted seven civilians from nearby areas to use them as human shields. The victims, consisting of three male civilians, and four female civilians were later killed, and their bodies were abandoned in a rubber plantation.

Massacre Deaths by Extrajudicial Killings per Township from January to March 2026

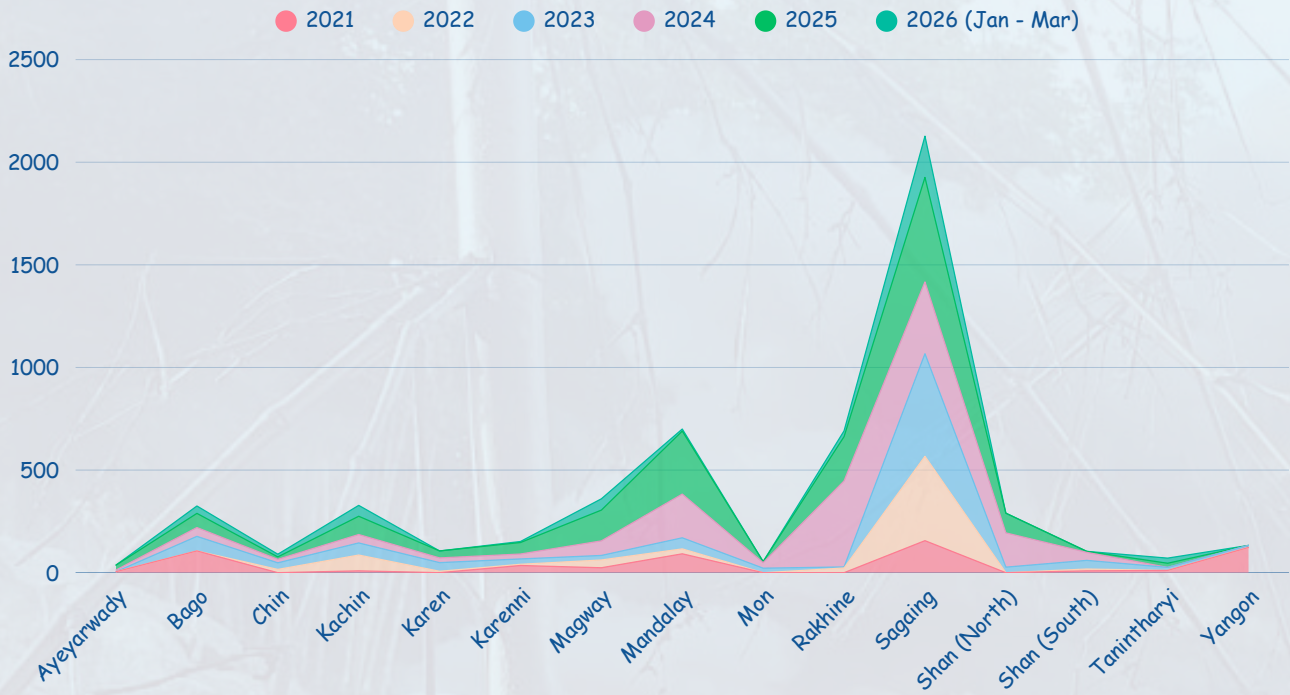
MASSACRE RESULTED FROM **ARTILLERY ATTACK**

Between January and March 2026, there was at least one incident of mass civilian casualties in Magway Region caused by artillery shelling by the military junta, resulting in the deaths of five civilians. On 1 March, artillery fired by junta forces stationed in a village in Aunglan Township landed and exploded in a nearby village, killing five civilians.

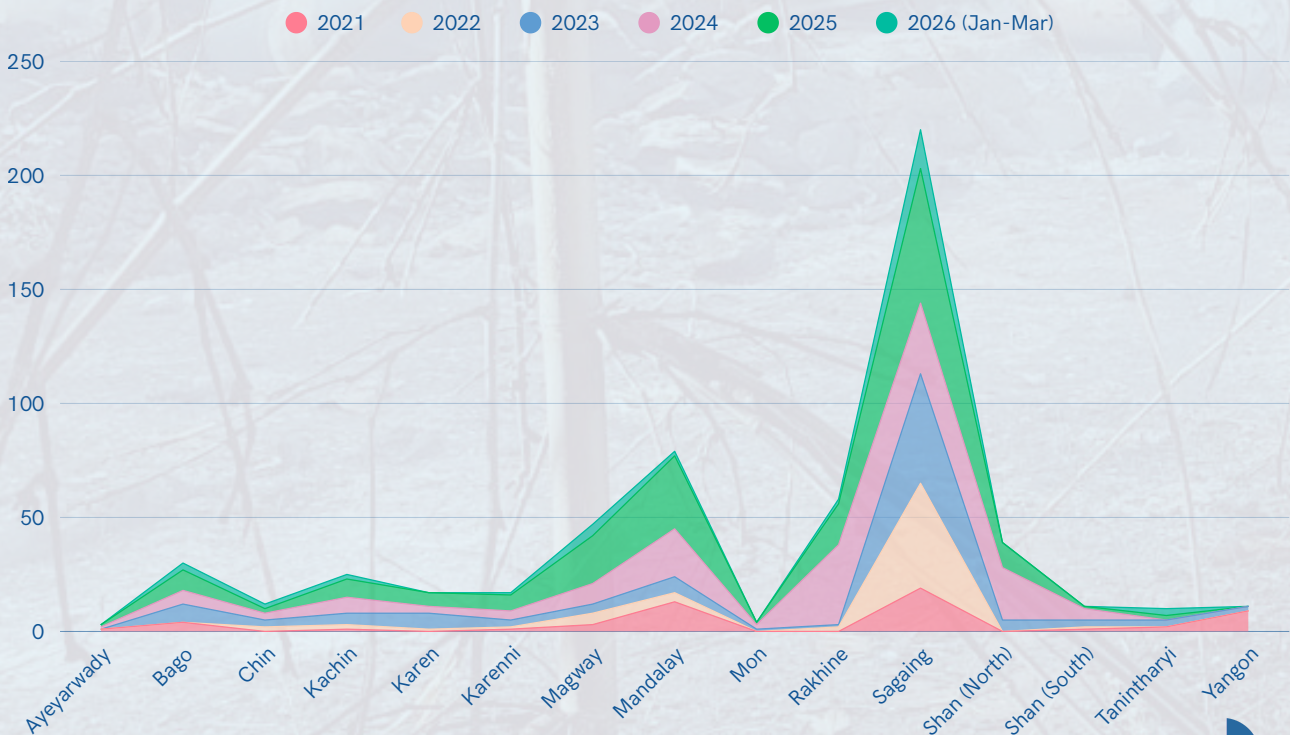
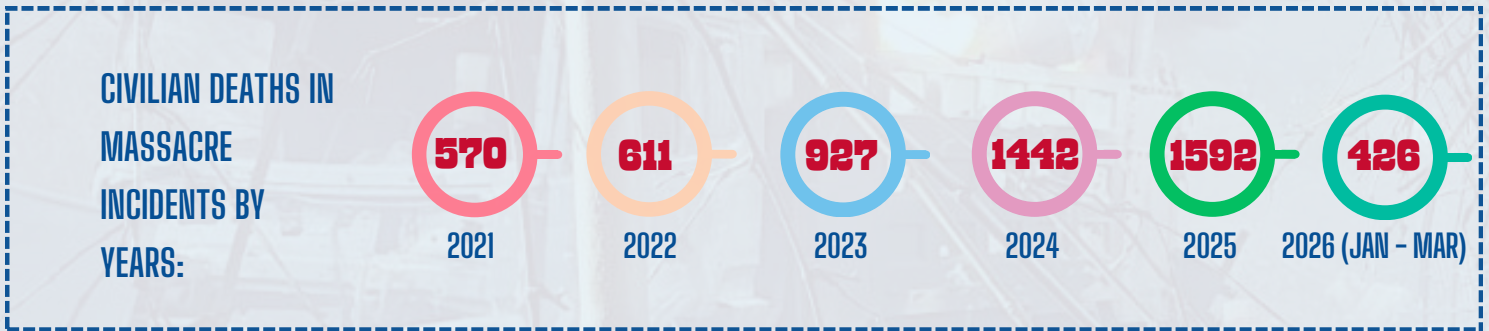

METHODOLOGY

A massacre refers to the deliberate killing of defenseless innocent civilians, perpetrated by a group in a certain place or region during a certain period of time. This report also examines the various patterns in which civilians are killed by these groups. The massacres in which five or more individuals were killed not only by the military, but also unknown groups were documented over the four-month period from September to December 2025. The information derives from reports of 43 independent media outlets and announcements made by revolutionary organizations.
